

Credit Hour Equivalency Calculations

One-Credit Hour Courses

A one-credit hour graduate course consists of 45 hours, 15 hours of which is in-seat time and 30 hours of which is practice (outside of class) time. To meet the requirement for 30 in-practice hours, you will be prompted throughout the course assignments to reflect upon how you are working to implement the course concepts in your professional environment and how implementing them is helping you meet your professional goals.

If you are not currently working in a classroom or school setting in which you can complete the implementation, you may do so by working with an audience that is available to you. This could mean working with students attending summer school, volunteering at a community center that offers educational programs, or school-aged students in your personal life (e.g., kids, neighbors). You may also work with same-age peers in your current work or college study setting.
